Franciacorta

Franciacorta, an area and designation located in the region of Lomabrida in the foothills of the Alps is Italy's answer to French Champagne. Here you will find magnificent sparkling wines designated as "Franciacorta" produced in the traditional "Metodo Classico" identical to the method of production used in its French counterpart "Champagne". The wines are predominantly produced with the classic varieties such as Chardonnay and Pinot Noir, although some small amounts of Pinot Bianco can also be found in many Franciacorta's.

Prosecco e Spumanti

Prosecco, is a light, fresh, sparkling wine made by the grape of the same name, which hails mostly from the region of Veneto in northeastern Italy, in particular the top Prosecco comes from a DOCG area of Conegliano and Valdobbiadine. There are also other beautiful sparkling wines that hail from all throught the Italian peninsula that deserve praise and attention such as Ferrari's brut from the area of Trentino in the Italian Alps.

Veneto

Veneto in Northeastern Italy is best known for its ancient wine producing regions of Soave for white wine and Valpolicella for the production of red wine. Since the times of the ancient romans this land has been hailed for its superb productions. The top whites of Veneto come predominantly from the hills surrounding the ancient town of "Soave", and are produced from the local varieties Garganega and Trebbiano di Soave. In recent times producers such as Leonildo Pieropan have taken Soave's ancient glory and propelled it to modern times making truly world class wines.

Piemonte

Toscana

Tuscany, by many considered the ultimate jewel Italy has to offer, is a land of mostly great red wines, however, it does produce some quite wonderful whites. Campania

Sardegna

Nestled in the beautiful Mediterranean Sea is Island of Sardegna. The island is almost like a small continent with different soils and landscapes throughout and of course its wines reflect the diversity of different terroirs on the island. The most well known white variety is Vermentino which can be both DOC from the majority of the island and the Top DOCG from the small mountainous region of Gallura in the northeast where the ultimate expression of Vermentino is achieved.

Italian Red Wines

Piemonte

Located in Northwestern Italy, Piemonte is host to the King and Queen of Italian wine, Barolo and Barbaresco which are both entirely made with the noble Nebbiolo grape. Along with the great Nebbiolo, this region also showcases two other native varieties known as Dolcetto, which grows at its best in the area of Dogliani and Barbera which expresses its maximum in the Alba, Asti and Monferreto. This is truly a wine lovers region where great reds depending on the variety flourish both in youth and age!

Trentino Alto Adige

Nestled in the Italian Alps, Trentino Alto Adige produces very elegant fruit driven wines that tend to be very aromatic and slightly higher in acidity due to the extreme temperatures found in the area, however, their higher acidity makes these wines great for pairing with food!

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Marche

Campania

Campania, the ancient country side of Roman Emperors is the home of the great Aglianico Grape. Aglianico, of Greek origins, is considered by most as the "Barolo" of the South with it's massive tannis and great potential for aging. The top expression of aglianico in this region comes in the form of Taurasi which tends to be the most celebrated red wine of the region.
